



Tim Stanclift

September 19, 1955 - October 24, 2019

Timothy "Tim" Stanclift, 64 of Greeley, died in his home surrounded by his loving family on Thursday, October 24, 2019 in Eaton, CO after a valiant and courageous battle with cancer.

Tim, son of Hudson and Arline, was born September 19, 1955 in Wichita, KS. He moved to Eaton CO at a very young age and graduated from Eaton High School in 1974. On June 12, 1976, he married Alayna Yarber. Tim & Alayna became lifetime residents of Greeley CO and Eaton CO. From 1975 to 1990 Tim worked for The Greeley Tribune, Greeley Printing Company, and Fries Brothers Printing as a master pressman. In 1990 he then began his beloved career in the Eaton School District where he worked for 28 years.

Tim was a kind, patient and honorable man who had a passion for his family, his friends and for the Eaton School District and community. Inspiring good morals, strong ethics, dedication to friends and family were all life-long goals.

Tim is survived by his wife Alayna, his daughter Angie and son-in-law Dustin Duncan and grandsons Dirk and Dawson; his daughter Alli and son-in-law Darin Duncan and grandsons Gunnar and Garret; and his son Todd and daughter-in-law Kelly Stanclift and granddaughter Haleigh and grandson Ryder all of Eaton CO. He is preceded in death by his parents.

Tim will be buried in a private ceremony at the Eaton Cemetery. A celebration of life and reception will take place beginning at 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday, October 30, 2019 at the Evangelical Free Church, 1325 3rd Street in Eaton CO. All are welcome to attend and celebrate Tim's life.



“ Tim and I spent a lot of time together during high school and even though I hadn't seen him but a couple of times after the summer of '74 the news of his passing hit me harder than I expected. That was because I had never assessed and articulated what a good friend Tim had been. He was outgoing and athletic, I the introverted nerd. Tim got me into mowing yards at age 14 by knocking on doors and he passed on to me his top paying lawn job. He got me the best job ever at Eaton Texaco. He talked me into trying baseball, track, basketball and eventually swimming, all of which I wouldn't of tried without his coaxing. And even though he was vastly more athletic than me he never criticized my lack of performance. Tim had me try hunting and we did a fair amount of fishing - from a small catfish pond out east to overnight-sleep-on-the-ground trips to the mountains where we fished for our breakfast. Tim believed in getting our assigned home chores done first, then play. We would ride our bikes to Windsor just to see a girl. We made trips out east in the Corvair station wagon where one would drive and the other would sit on the hood with a .22 and shoot at whatever moved. And way too many trips around The Block in Greeley and yes, way too many beers consumed. We raised some hell and our weekend escapades grew in grandier by school on Monday morning. We shared a couple of significant car wrecks as well. I don't think that we committed any felonies but if we did the statute of limitations has passed! We jammed a lot of fun into 4 years. And Tim was always respectful, to my parents, to church members when he would attend church events that I invited him to, everywhere. I can tell from the tributes left here that not sustaining that friendship into adulthood is my loss. God, please be with his family and bless them during this time.
